PADDLE TO LUMMI 2019

Manzanita | Hosted by Darrell Hillaire, Director

This film highlights 104 tribal canoes that gathered on the Lummi Reservation to celebrate the Spirit of the Potlatch.

LANGUAGE KEEPERS

Tule | Hosted by Richard Bugbee, Board Chair

This series of 15 short videos chronicle the work of Advocates Master Apprentice teams at home and in their communities. Tribes filmed are Karuk, Kawaiisu, Tolowa and Wukchumni.

SHASH JAA': BEARS EARS

This film documents the effort to make Bears Ears a National Monument and how tribes worked together to save a sacred place.

WARRIOR WOMEN

Red Tail Hawk | Hosted by Jennifer Woodcock Medicine Horse

In the 1970s, organizers of the American Indian Movement fought for Native survival and Liberation. This film explores how activist legacies are passed down and transformed from generation to generation.

OHIYESA: THE SOUL OF AN INDIAN

This documentary follows Kate Beane (Dakota) as she examines the life of Charles Eastman (Ohiyesa) from traditional Dakota boyhood, through education at Dartmouth College, and in later roles as physician, author, lecturer, and Native American advocate.

WORDS FROM A BEAR

This film examines the enigmatic life of Pulitzer Prize-winning writer N. Scott Momaday, one of Native America's most celebrated authors of poetry and prose.

MANKILLER

Wilma Mankiller humbly defied the odds and overcame insurmountable obstacles to fight injustice and give a voice to the voiceless. MANKILLER reminds audiences of the true meaning of servant leadership and serves as a wake-up call to take action for positive change.
