ACTION ITEMS – Priority Poll Questions

Below is a list of priorities as determined by tribal librarians and other stakeholders. Summit participants will prioritize these Action Items or add new ones.

- 1. Establish a program to identify and obtain resources, provide training, vet digital literacy programs, secure funding, and track successful tribal digital inclusion projects.
- 2. Develop and fund "ready-to-go" programs that can help small tribal libraries implement projects such as hotspot lending, MakerSpaces, technology labs, and other programs.
- 3. Provide technical support for tribal libraries seeking to develop or expand digital inclusion activities.
- 4. Work with funders and policy makers to ensure that tribal libraries have the financial resources needed to assure access to digital technologies.
- 5. Create and staff an E-Rate task force to help tribal libraries access funds and manage successful programs.
- 6. Advocate for more engagement between tribal leadership and tribal library staff when addressing broadband planning and funding.
- 7. Advocate that tribal library be included in the National Center for Education Statistics survey.
- 8. Curate and develop a clearinghouse of on-demand, self-directed virtual training tailored to the digital inclusion needs of Native communities.
- 9. Establish recommended standards of service and provide training, resources, and funding to help tribal libraries meet the standards.
- 10. Advocate for State Library Agencies to identify and implement services and programs for tribal libraries.
